#### The Gift of Travel

As you may know, I recently returned from a family trip to Germany and Austria. It was a privilege and a gift to be able to travel for two weeks with my family (parents, my brother and his family, as well as my own). I do not use the words *privilege* or *gift* lightly in this context. I recognize there are many

people for whom such travel is simply not possible for one reason or another.

Being granted paid-time-off from work is a privilege I do not take for granted. Despite the many studies that demonstrate the value of employees being granted paid time off from work, many employees in our nation are given precious few days to be away from work without it impacting their pay. For many this limits what they are able to do with that time and often the few days workers are given are used to care for children (or parents) or attend medical and other appointments. I give thanks to House of Prayer and the leadership of this congregation for agreeing to include paid time off in the benefits that I am afforded as your pastor.

I also recognize this trip was a *gift* because I was fortunate to travel with my extended family and, through the generosity of my parents, have many of the costs of the trip paid for. Without this gift it would not have been possible for our family of four to spend two weeks in Germany and Austria. Having time together with family to deepen our bonds and create memories (admittedly some of those memories we could have foregone, like our luggage not traveling with us for 10 days, but so be it) is also a gift to treasure. I can already hear "do you remember when ..." and the laughter that will ensue.

Having had the privilege and gift of travel throughout my life, I recognize the richness of

such experiences in shaping my worldview and my understanding of how my faith intersects with a world stage. On this particular trip we had the opportunity to see some of the historical places where Martin Luther lived and studied and published thoughts that ignited the Protestant Reformation. We had the opportunity to be blessed with music that transcended language and spoke to my soul in ways words alone could not. We visited cathedrals built with the intention to inspire faith in followers of Jesus. We saw the grandeur of mountains, rivers, and fields that were reminders of God's provision through the daily needs of life in lands far and near.

I know that many of you have also had opportunities to travel throughout the United States and around the world. I hope that those travels have provided you opportunity to reflect on ways you have been enriched and challenged through those experiences. I hope you have created memories with family and friends in those times that you look back on with joy and appreciation.

I wonder if travel is something that people of House of Prayer might consider engaging in together. Recognizing ways we can be drawn together in community as we experience places, foods, and cultures together, is there a place that is on your heart (or your bucket list) that you think, "a trip to this place or event could inform or deepen my faith?" It doesn't have to be a multi-week pilgrimage to some far-off land (though it could be) it might be a day trip nearby or an evening outing to a concert or festival. Maybe you've wanted to spend a weekend at Luther Park or hike and camp in God's creation together. Is there a mission that is on your heart that requires leaving the familiarity of your home to accomplish and would be enriched in doing it with the partnership of others from House of Prayer?

If the thought of encountering experiences with others at House of Prayer intrigues or excites you, let me know. We can plan together for how to make such events happen.

Song lyrics, movie dialogue, and political quotes have played a role in sharing messages for your consideration.

So as August 2023 rolls in, I would like to quote an actress named Helen Shaw (1897-1997). Helen began acting when she was 82 years old and acted in only eight movies. You may recognize Helen from roles she played in *Twilight Zone*, the Movie (1983) and Parenthood (1989). She also made a big splash with her 1989 appearance on *The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson*. A nerdy trivia tidbit: Helen was visiting Egypt in February 1923 and was present when King Tut's tomb

was opened by the party led by archaeologist Howard Carter.

It is a monologue that Helen made in *Parenthood* that I offer this month. Helen played Steve Martin's grandmother in this movie, so her character brought a lifetime of wisdom to the following words (responding to Steve Martin's character complaining about his complicated life):

"You know, when I was 19, Grandpa took me on a roller coaster. Up, down, up, down. Oh, what a ride! I always wanted to go again. You know, it was just so interesting to me that a ride could make me so frightened, so scared, so sick, so excited, and so thrilled all together! Some didn't like it. They went on the merry-go-round. That just goes around. Nothing. I like the roller coaster. You get more out of it."

What does this have to do with anything, you ask? I think it's about acceptance, especially the things in life that we can't control. If life has taught me anything, that in order to have the high points in life, I need to accept that there will also be low points. I believe that perspective helps achieve and maintain balance.

I submit that the House of Prayer family can take something away from Helen's words. HOP has weathered the highs and lows that any individual or gathering of people could expect to experience in 70 years of existence. We have the means, talent, and ability to move into our shared future, and I know that this church is in good hands.

### **Leadership Ministry Team Update**

#### **Monthly Finance Report**

It is summer and our schedules can change during the warm Minnesota months. Help keep our cash flows flowing. Consider giving on-line. Financially, House of Prayer is in a good space.

Including all 2023 cash flows, net operating deficit and net dedicated surplus, HOP ended the Fiscal Year on June 30, 2023 with a net surplus of \$30.8 K. See reports for the details of the Operating and Dedicated Funds. Total annual operating revenue of \$618 K came in 3% below budget. Offerings were \$406 K, or 6% below budget. Compared to prior fiscal year, offerings were down 4%, and total revenue down 2%. Total operating expenses for the fiscal year were \$621K, or 10% below budget. Compared to prior year, total operating expenses were down about \$27 K.

Savings were due to decisions to delay adding an additional visitation pastor, larger building repairs, and wifi hotspots. Areas with higher expenses included utilities, insurance. Dedicated funds used included a significant electrical panel replacement, a new church awning, J Kietzer anniversary celebration exp, HOP grant pay and and a variety of small expenditures. The net annual increase in dedicated funds of \$33 K is from a surplus in Operating Reserves.

I have been an accountant for over 40 years but this is the first time I have been a church treasurer. With Patti's help I have learned much over the last few weeks. Thanks Patti!

Adolphus College. He studied organ performance with Thomas Murray, Charles Krigbaum, Gerre Hancock and David Fienen. In addition to music, he pursued coursework in Lutheran theology, Lutheran Confessions and liturgy at the Yale Divinity School. His Master's thesis focused on the musical interpretation of theological themes related to the Lutheran Catechism in the organ works of J. S. Bach.

Tim has served as an organist/choir director/ director of music throughout the United States. His first position out of college was at St. Mark's Lutheran in Jacksonville, FL. He was also

For seven years, Tim was the Chapel Organist at the University of St. Thomas where he accompanied the Liturgical Choir, gave recitals and mentored liturgical music students.
