- C: We come as we are, embraced by the grace of God


+GREETING







READING: Isaiah 58:1-12

¹Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet! Announce to my people their rebellion, to the house of Jacob their sins. ²Yet day after day they seek me and delight to know my ways, as if they were a nation that practiced righteousness and did not forsake the ordinance of their God; they ask of me righteous judgments, they delight to draw near to God. ³"Why do we fast, but you do not see? Why humble ourselves, but you do not notice?" Look, you serve your own interest on your fast day, and oppress all your workers. ⁴Look, you fast only to quarrel

and to fight and to strike with a wicked fist. Such fasting as you do today will not make your voice heard on high. ⁵Is such the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes? Will you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the LORD?



⁶Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? ⁷Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin? ⁸Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you, the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. ⁹Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, Here I am. If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, ¹⁰if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday. ¹¹The LORD will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places, and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail. ¹²Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in.

Silence for Reflection

INVITATION TO LENT

L: Friends in Christ, today with the whole church we enter the time of remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, and our life in Christ is renewed.

We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to a discipline that contends against evil and resists whatever leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to the discipline of Lent—self-examination and repentance, prayer, and fasting, sacrificial giving, and works of love—strengthened by the gifts of word and sacrament. Let us continue our journey through these forty days to the great Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection.

+CONFESSION OF SIN

L: God of our Hearts,

not of our outer garments, nor our church structures,

nor our programs and human plans:

C: You are the only one who can make us pure.

You are the only one who can wash us clean of all our sin and guilt.

L: You are the merciful and just God. If we turn, we see you.

C: Help us to tune our hearts to resonate your grace, as together we confess:

L: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength.

C: We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven. Have mercy on us, O God.

L: We have shut our ears to your call to serve as Christ served us.

C: We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit. Have mercy on us, O God.

L: Our past unfaithfulness, the pride, envy, hypocrisy, and apathy that have infected our lives, we confess to you.

C: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people, we confess to you.

L: Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to share the faith that is in us, we confess to you.

C: Our neglect of human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty, we confess to you.

L: Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you.

C: Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you. Have mercy on us, O God.

L: Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.

C: Receive our confession, O God, for your mercy is great.

IMPOSITION OF ASHES & PERSONAL PRAYER

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. May these ashes be a sign of our mortality and penitence, reminding us that only by the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ are we given eternal life; through the same Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Please come forward on your own without the ushers' signal. You may come immediately or you may wait - and if you prefer not to take part, you may remain seated without embarrassment. If you wish for someone to pray with you after ashes have been imposed on your forehead, simply walk to the nearest station where someone will gladly hear your prayer concerns and offer personal prayer.

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.


