

+Call to Confession & Assurance of Forgiveness

L: The apostle Paul says:

"I'm not saying that I have this all together, that I have it made. But I am well on my way, reaching out for Christ, who has so wondrously reached out for me." Is it possible to claim these words as our own and repeat them as our words?

Let's have a time of silence where we think about these words and their place in our lives as followers of Jesus Christ.

Silence for self reflection

L: Let us pray: Merciful God, we hear these words of Paul, and know that his life was spent living and proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ not only to the people of his day, but to people in every age since. He could invite people not only to do as he said, but to do as he did.

When we are happy to tell others to do as we say, but want the freedom to do as we choose, even if that means surrendering some of our Christian values; **C: Forgive us, O God.**

L: When we look to others than Jesus Christ as the source of our standards; C: Forgive us, O God.

L: When Jesus weeps over our behaviour even as he wept over Jerusalem; C: Forgive us, O God.

L: God of grace and truth, we remember Jesus' commitment to grace and love for all people. Empower us with the Holy Spirit to deepen our commitment to follow Jesus, even when that means being ridiculed or persecuted, or sharing in the struggles and sufferings of others. This we pray in Jesus' name.

C: Amen

L: Hear the good news:

Those who are in Christ are a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come. All this is from God to whom we have been reconciled through Christ. And so I declare to you, in Jesus Christ we are forgiven. **C: Thanks be to God!**

L: Holy God,

C: you reveal yourself to us in Jesus Christ, the light of the world. Help us to shine that light in all we say and do in this world, and help us to see that light in all those we meet along our journey. In Jesus' name we pray. C: Amen.




Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:14-20

For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. ¹⁵ And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves but for the one who for their sake died and was raised.

¹⁶ From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view;^[a] even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view,^[b] we no longer know him in that way. ¹⁷ So if anyone is in Christ, there^[c] is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!^[d] ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself,^[e] not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰ So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ: be reconciled to God.

L: Word of God, Word of Life: C: Thanks be to God!

When [Judas] had gone out [from the Last Supper], Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. ³² If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. ³³ Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me, and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' ³⁴ I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another.






