

+Greeting

L: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. C: And also with you.

+Call to Worship

L: Lent is not a time for being miserable, but for taking stock and resetting our aims for following Christ.

C: Loving God, in you we trust, let us never fool ourselves.

L: Lent is an opportunity for healthy repentancerepentance for our indifference in face of the permeating evil of the world, repentance for personal sins which we have glossed over as "mere foibles."

C: According to your loving kindness, remember me, God of goodness and saving grace.

L: Lent is a time for joy; the exhibitant that comes- from defying temptations, from turning our face to the light that shines on the narrow path of Christ Jesus, from walking into adverse winds and enjoying small victories day by day. C: Shape us to know your ways, O God, teach us your way, for you are the God of

salvation.

+Call to Confession & Assurance of Forgiveness

L: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

L: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. Most merciful God, C: we confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name, Amen.

L: Hear the good news:

God, who is rich in mercy, loves us even when we were dead in sin, and makes us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved. In the name of Jesus Christ your sins are forgiven. Almighty God strengthen you with power through the Holy Spirit and in the love of Jesus Christ.

C: Amen.

L: God of the Cosmos,

C: You created the world with a plan and have placed each of us into that world with purpose. When we think we know better than you what the plan should be, redirect us with love in a way that gets our attention so that we might live into your intention. In Jesus' love we pray, Amen.

Word

First Reading: Numbers 21:4-9

From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom, but the people became discouraged on the way. ⁵ The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." ⁶ Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. ⁷ The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the LORD and against you; pray to the LORD to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸ And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." ⁹ So Moses made a serpent of bronze and put it upon a pole, and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22

- ¹O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever.
- ²Let the redeemed of the LORD say so, those he redeemed from trouble
- ³ and gathered in from the lands,

from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south


- ¹⁷ Some were sick through their sinful ways and because of their iniquities endured affliction;
- ¹⁸ they loathed any kind of food, and they drew near to the gates of death.
- ¹⁹ Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress;
- ²⁰ he sent out his word and healed them and delivered them from destruction.
- ²¹ Let them thank the LORD for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind.
- ²² And let them offer thanksgiving sacrifices and tell of his deeds with songs of joy.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:1-10

You were dead through the trespasses and sins ² in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient. ³ All of us once lived among them in the passions of our flesh, doing the will of flesh and senses, and we were by nature children of wrath, like everyone else, ⁴ but God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us ⁵ even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— ⁶ and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷ so that in the ages to come he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. ⁸ For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— ⁹ not the result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰ For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we may walk in them.

L: The Good News of God. **C: Praise to you, O Christ**. *You may be seated*


