I'm curious how you hear the word *RETREAT*? What image comes to your mind first? Is it the image of "getting away" for a time of regrouping and regathering and relaxing often in an idyllic setting? Do you get the image of a military battle in which

one side calls RETREAT in the midst of casualties and losses?

I just returned from the Leading Well Learning Retreat, a continuing education event that I have attended annually for the past seven years. The goals for the event are Sabbath Rest, Practical Learning, and Collegial Support. Each year the event provides me with all of those pieces and part of the "take away" for me is always a renewed focus of where God is leading me in my personal life and ministry. I give thanks for the congregations that have afforded me the opportunity to attend annually.

There is often a "word" that seems to speak loudly throughout the retreat and this year that word is "grounded." This is another peculiar word which might evoke different ideas for different people. Afterall, we probably can all share a story of being "grounded" as a child for some misbehavior. We also might be able to find those events or beliefs in our lives that keep us "grounded" or anchored in who we are.

During the season of Epiphany, we spent time as a congregation focusing on our Core Values; the statements that ground us as a congregation. As we did that I spent time listening to what was said through the specific questions that were asked, but also in the comments on the periphery of the conversation. One statement that resonated from multiple sources was a sense that members of House of Prayer have poured a lot of energy into getting through the transition process and a wondering of how much energy we collectively have to move into "something new," as Isaiah 43 would call us to be ready for.

March 2023

As we approach the season of Lent, it feels like a good time for us to **retreat** as a congregation. Not in the sense of a military battle where we return with our casualties in defeat, but in the sense of regrouping to gain energy for what is next.

We'll have the opportunity throughout Lent to gather on Sunday mornings for worship and Fellowship and join with our collaboration partners at Woodlake for Wednesday meals, worship, and co-creating conversation. It's a chance for us to strengthen our relationships. It's a chance to ask questions and hear perspectives that we might not get on Sunday mornings. It's a chance for us to collectively consider something new that God might be calling us into.

Wednesday evening activities will all be held at Woodlake Lutheran Church this year (House of Prayer hosted last year). Being in a different setting can sometimes be unsettling, but it can also open us up to seeing things differently as we sit in different spaces and engage with different people as well as our many friends who will join us.

It is my prayer that you will take the time to engage the season of Lent in this way and together we will grow as a congregation into the future that God has imagined for us.

In this winter of TV binge watching, it seems like some movies are on every day (I mean, EVERY DAY!). Tell me you haven't noticed <u>The Shawshank Redemption</u>, <u>Lethal Weapon</u>, <u>Die Hard</u>, <u>Top Gun</u>, <u>Ghostbusters</u>, <u>A Few Good Men</u> and <u>The God-father</u> (to name just a few) during your channel surfing--at least eight times each since Christmas.

One of the frequently played movie series I've noticed at least eight times, and enjoy watching, are the time travel-themed <u>Back to the Future</u> films. In this film series, our time traveler, Marty McFly, starts his adventure in 1985 and eventually visits 1955, 2015 and 1885 on his way back to 1985. Marty's girlfriend, Jennifer, accidentally travels to 2015 as part of the journey—all in a DeLorean.

Fast-forward to the of the last installment in the trilogy (Back to the Future III), when Marty and Jennifer have a brief reunion in 1985 with the time-travel inventor, Dr. Emmett Brown.

I always smile when I hear the exchange between Jennifer and Dr. Brown:

Jennifer: Dr. Brown-I brought back this note from the future, and now it's erased!

Dr. Brown: Of course, it's erased!

Jennifer: But what does that mean?

Dr. Brown: It means that your future hasn't been written yet; no one's has! Your future is whatever you make it...so make it a good one!

I really should just stop there; you know where I'm going with this.

During his Epiphany sermon series, his challenge questions to the congregation, and the responses we have written on Post-It notes and emails, Pastor Eric has been leading the congregation on a journey to discover and embrace the answer to: "Who Are We Created to Be?"

What you and I are writing and considering in those answers <u>are</u> the "future that hasn't been written yet" for House of Prayer's mission and calling. First Communion Class



At House of Prayer we practice an Open Table at Communion. This means that anyone who steps forward with hands outstretched to receive the gifts that Christ offers will receive them regardless of age, education, church mem-

bership, or any other factor. We trust that Jesus is working in this sacrament beyond our human understanding.

We also believe that knowing our beliefs around Communion is important, so we offer Communion Instruction for those who want to understand the Lutheran theology of Communion and our beliefs as a church. We'll be offering this instruction as part of our Lent collaboration with Woodlake Lutheran on Wednesday, March 1, 8, 15 from 7-7:45pm. We invite you to gather at Woodlake for a light meal between 5:30-6:30pm, join in worship at 6:30, and then participate in Communion Instruction from 7-7:45 on March 1, 8, and 15 – or if your schedule allows only the class portion, arrive at 7pm.

We are asking that each child who participates be accompanied by a parent so that the conversations we start can continue at home – and there are no age limits on who can attend – if your child has been asking about Communion or seems curious when they see Communion served in worship, the time is right. 
