#### **Ecclesia Semper Reformanda est**

It's hard for me to let the month of October pass without reference to the Reformation and the occasional Latin phrase (especially since I know so few of them). On October 31, or the Sunday prior to it, Lutherans celebrate Reformation Day. For some it is a reminder of the

history of the protestant church, the day that Rev. Dr. Martin Luther nailed 95 theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. I like to think of Reformation Day as a reminder of this wonderful Latin phrase, *Ecclesia Semper Reformanda est*, which is roughly translated to mean, *the church reformed, ever reforming*.

Think about those words for a moment. *The church reformed*. I don't think any of us would deny that the church of today is not the church of 500 years ago, or maybe 50 years ago, or even 5 years ago.

Ever Reforming. These words likely bring more anxiety to us. Many of us like our church the way it is. We are here because of what we experience today. We don't want things to change. The good news is that as we change and grow as a church, God is leading us and we go forward together.

Over the past few months we've been discerning where God is leading us and what God is calling us to do as a congregation. To that end, I share with you this mission statement that encompasses who we are, how we live out that reality, and what we hope to accomplish in living that way:

House of Prayer is a gathering of God's people who value Welcoming, Relationships, Compassionate Community and Openness.

We connect our faith to our daily lives by caring for each other, our neighbor, and our creation; nurturing the gift of music; being inwardly fed to outwardly feed; and collaborating with others so that all would encounter Christ in each person.

I know, that's a lot of words; but the words contained there are important to get the full picture of who we are and who God is calling us to be. In fact, there are more words to support that statement to really explain what we mean in some of these phrases. But there's a shorter way to remember this statement as well:

House of Prayer is a gathering of God's people connecting our faith to our daily lives so that all would encounter Christ in each person.

This is what God is calling us to do. The words of this mission statement are rooted in our history and will guide our decisions and our ministry in the months and years to come. You'll see these words. You'll remember these words. Together we will live out these words to bring to fruition the prayer we pray each week in worship, "thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

May these words guide the reformation of a church always reforming.

## **Leadership Ministry Team Update**

#### **Monthly Finance Report**

Summer months are typically slow for church donations. However, HOP financial activity compares favorably to budget, and offerings are running higher compared to prior year. August net operating gain was breakeven compared to a budgeted \$15 K deficit. Fiscal YTD (Jul & Aug) is a deficit of \$7.9 K, better than our budgeted deficit of \$34 K.

REVENUE - Offerings continue to come in a bit higher than expected, up 19% over budget and 9% higher than prior year.

EXPENSES - Aug and fiscal YTD expenses are 12% lower than budget. Savings are primarily due to the budgeted expense for an unfilled care ministry position, utilities costs holding steady, building repairs minimal, and lower youth summer expenses due to programming changes. Timing in a couple of other bills such as HVAC and IT consultant created small increases compared to budget, but nothing concerning.

House of Prayer has committed to providing 9% of our offerings to reaching out beyond our walls in this fiscal year. Our current mission partners are: EveryMeal, Loaves and Fishes, LSS, Luther Park, Meals on Wheels, Minneapolis Synod, Simpson Shelter, Tapestry ministry, VEAP and Lutheran Disaster Response. Through August our Outreach Payments are \$5,666.

Additional HOP Foundation grant funds are provided for the Friendship Fund (Holiday and Walmart gift cards). This provides stable funding for that program which is also included in our monthly budgeted operating funds and donations accepted directly from the congregation.






#### **HOP Fall Music Ministry**





Our ever-popular fellowship hour continues to be a wonderful time for gathering and connecting.




We wholeheartedly thank our devoted volunteers who faithfully make the coffee, pick up the donuts, set-up, serve and clean-up every Sunday morning.
